

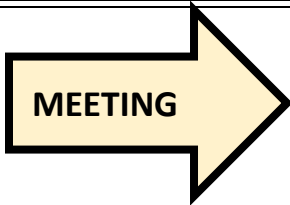

PROGRAM SPEAKER: Corina McDonald
TOPIC: The Diavik Diamond Mine-Waste and Waste Not

The talk "Diavik Diamond Mine – Waste and Waste Not" will briefly touch on the origin of the famous diamond mine and current status as a major producer of Canadian diamonds. Corina will then share her experiences, adventures and photographs at the mine while helping construct the initial phase of a 10-year waste rock research project. The Diavik Diamond Mine is a diamond mine in the North Slave Region of the Northwest Territories, Canada, about 300 kilometres northeast of Yellowknife.

Corina McDonald is the curator of the Earth Sciences Museum and Science Museum and Galleries in the Faculty of Science at the University of Waterloo. She has been curating since 2012.

Corina grew up in Wawa, ON, an area well known for its beauty and significant geological richness. Her appreciation for natural beauty lead Corina to explore her interests as a photographer and potter while her interests in geology lead her to study earth science, completing a BSc. and MSc. at the Univ. of Waterloo. While completing her geology degree Corina helped conduct rock waste research at the Diavik Diamond mine which is the location and focus of her talk.

Dominion Diamond Mines announced on **December 14, 2018**, that a **552-carat yellow diamond** was found at the **Diavik Mine**, located in Northwest Territories, Canada. They believe that this is the largest diamond ever found in North America. It surpasses the Foxfire, a 187.7-carat diamond, also found at Diavik in 2015, which is believed to be the previous largest diamond found in North America. Dominion plans to have the stone cut by a master diamond cutter and certified by the Canadamark program. (Rio Tinto PLC owns a 60% stake in the mine through their Diavik Diamond Mines subsidiary. Dominion Diamond Mines ULC owns a 40% stake in the mine through their Dominion Diamond Diavik Limited Partnership. Operations at the mine are managed by Diavik Diamond Mines.)

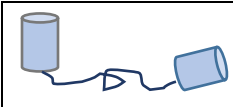
VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS:

OUR DECEMBER 14, 2018 POT LUCK DINNER, SILENT AUCTION WAS A REALLY GOOD MEETING.

The Pot Luck Dinner was excellent with quite an assortment of delicious food. We had appetizers, salads, chicken pot pie, Ham, Scalloped potatoes, lasagna, chili, buns, Kentucky Fried Chicken, pie, brownies, squares and cookies and more.

Charles Briscoe was our first “Show and Tell” Speaker. Charles spoke about different Rocks from **Blow-Me-Down Provincial Park, Lake Harbour, Newfoundland.** The Park is a small, scenic park situated in a peninsula jutting into the Bay-of-Islands. The selection of rocks that Charles showed us included: **Peridotite, Serpentine and Virginite.**

Virginite occurs in Newfoundland/Labrador in rocks that were part of the sea floor in an ancient ocean hundreds of millions of years ago. The Baie Verte Peninsula Miner's Museum in Newfoundland has amongst the museum's displays samples of Virginite, a Quartz-Carbonate-Fuchsite compound. The Fuchsite, or Chromium Mica, gives the mineral its bright green colour. Peridotite is a generic name used for coarse-grained, dark-colored, ultramafic igneous rocks. Peridotites usually contain **olivine** as their primary mineral, frequently with other mafic minerals such as pyroxenes and amphiboles. Their silica content is low compared to other **igneous rocks**, and they contain very little **quartz** and **feldspar**.

Serpentine is a group of minerals used as architectural, ornamental, and gem materials. A source of asbestos. Serpentine minerals form where **peridotite**, dunite, and other ultramafic rocks undergo hydrothermal metamorphism. Ultramafic rocks are rare at Earth's surface but are abundant at the oceanic **moho**, the boundary between the base of the oceanic crust and the upper mantle.

Richard Waddington was our second “Show and Tell” Speaker. Richard spoke about the unusual spherical rock formations that erode from the underlying shale beds in Southern Ontario along the shores of **Lake Huron at Kettle Point.** These rock formations are known as “**Kettles**” and are unique to only three locations in the world. Don't rush out to obtain any “Kettles” as it is illegal to remove them from the site. For the photography buffs there should be no problem collecting photos of the “Kettles”. MINERAL OF THE MONTH: Our 2019 Paris Gem & Mineral Show is featuring "Birthstones of the Year". Each month in 2019 our Newsletter "Mineral of the Month" will be the "Alternative Gem Stone" instead of the "Birthstone". January's "Alternative Gem Stone" is: "Rose Quartz".

The Gemstone Rose Quartz

Rose Quartz is the rosy pink variety of Quartz. Its color is usually soft, ranging from very light pink to medium pink in intensity. It is often hazy or turbid, which makes it lack good transparency. Rose Quartz is fairly common and found in many places throughout the world, and can occur in very large examples in nature. This allows exceedingly large gemstones to be cut from it. The relative abundance of Rose Quartz, and its frequent lack of full transparency, diminish its importance as a pink gemstone in relation to other pink gemstones such as and Topaz, Tourmaline, and Kunzite.

All About

Rose Quartz is a very affordable gemstone. Due to its often hazy color and frequent flaws, it is more often tumbled or used as beads over faceting into gemstone cuts. A deeper pink color in Rose Quartz makes it less common and more desirable, though certain forms of Rose Quartz may fade upon repeated prolonged exposure to strong lighting. Asterism in Rose Quartz, in the form of a six-ray star, does occur but is rare.

Uses

Rose Quartz is a minor pink gemstone. It sometimes cut as cabochons or hearts, and is often tumbled or made into beads for use in bracelets, necklaces, and as costume jewellery. Large spheres and carvings are also cut from Rose Quartz.

Varieties

Star Rose Quartz - Rose Quartz displaying asterism, in the form of a six-rayed star.

Rose Quartz Treatments and Enhancements



Rose Quartz gemstones are generally colored naturally and not treated.

The chief source of Rose Quartz is Brazil, though it is also prevalent in Madagascar, South Africa, Mozambique, India, and the United States (Maine and South Dakota).

Similar Gemstones

Rose Quartz is similar to Kunzite, but is often cloudier and lacks the dichroism present on Kunzite. Pink Tourmaline, pink Topaz and pink Spinel are generally more intensely colored and with greater transparency.
